Catholic Character – The Synod

The Wellington Archdiocese Synod has been invoked by Cardinal John Dew for the 15-17th of September. Mary Ryan will be attending on behalf of our school community. The Synod is focusing on rethinking our church and pastoral leaders' ministry to us all. As Cardinal John states this means "Being bold and creative in rethinking the goals, structures, styles and methods of evangelization and service to the world in our Archdiocese with its diverse communities. Please pray for the 350 delegates who are representing their community in reimagining how our church engages with us all.

NetSafe Tips

On Monday night a small group braved the weather and explored the ways they can support their young people as they move in to online environments. Over the next ten weeks I will share with you some tips from both the NetSafe website and our school's experiences to support your child/children to be Responsible, Resilient and Respectful when using the online environment.

1. SET EXPECTATIONS

Talk to your child about the type of behaviours you'd like them to adopt. For example, how long they should spend online, what apps and social media sites you'd like them to use and what is appropriate content to view. This will be different depending on the age of your child, and what you feel comfortable with. Technological options like parental controls can help, but it needs to be teamed with online safety education.

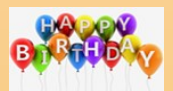
Winter Netball Meeting 5 September 3.10pm, Rm 1 Message from Jacqui
