#### Attitude five: IN CONSTANT PRAYER

•Holy people find an exclusive concern with this world to be narrow and stifling, and, amid their own concerns and commitments, they long for God, losing themselves in praise and contemplation.

• In the silences we create we can discern, in the light of the Spirit, the paths of holiness to which the Lord is calling us.
