Lunchtime Trial Starting Week 5

We have been reviewing our current lunchtime organisation. Currently our children have a large snack between 11-11:20am during morning tea. They have supervised lunch at 12:30pm before they have playtime. What we have noticed is that many children are rushing through or not finishing their lunch as they want to be playing. Those that are slow to eat also miss out on getting play equipment out. Between week 5 and the end of Term 4 we will be trialling play first, eat second. This will mean children will go directly out to play between 12:30pm-1:15pm, a bell will be rung at 1:15pm and the children will gather to say grace and then eat together as a family. At the end of the trial we will review with our tamariki, kaiako and whanau as to whether this will become a permanent change in 2019.

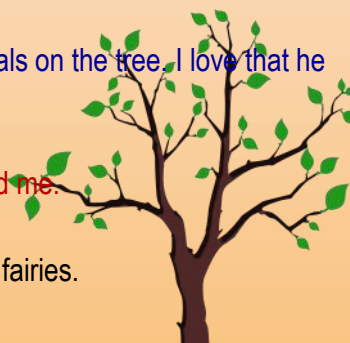

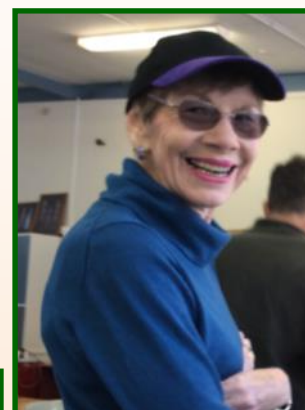
