During the month of November all churches have a Remembrance Book within which you may place the names of those who are special to you who have passed away. These people will then be prayed for at every mass that is celebrated within that church during November. We call these people the Holy Souls. It is also possible to request a special mass be said in the memory of a loved one. This can be done by completing a mass intention envelope often found in the entrance of the church.

Board of Trustees Consultation

Recently the Board of Trustees asked our children what makes their school special. The older students were also asked to write a new mission statement for our school. The responses have been correlated into themes, and are on display in our school hall. Please feel free to add your own ideas using the templates available.

Changes to Green Cards for 2019

We have listened to recent feedback from our tamariki and whanau community. We will be introducing some changes to our Green Card system in 2019. Currently children have their Green Card ticket tally card clipped each time, and receive a card to commemorate when they have received 20, 40, 60, 80 etc green cards. In 2019, when achieving the milestones of 40, 60, 80 and 100, children will have their photo published in the newsletter and be able to choose a special privilege. The Y1-4 and Y5-8 will have separate containers to fill, which will result in junior and senior green card rewards. This way we can reward our older students in a way that is enjoyable for them. Once the small containers are filled they will go in to our larger container, and when that is full we will have a whole school reward.

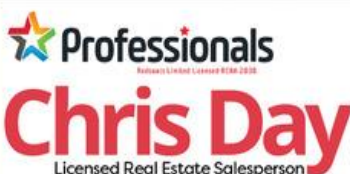
